Year 4's are part of a very exciting project to celebrate the Commonwealth Games coming to Birmingham. We have been linked with schools in India and we are the lead school for a cluster of schools in the East of the city. Our children will be working with Sampad, an East Asian cultural organisation to learn a bhangra dance. The schools in Delhi are learning songs and dances from the West End musical Wicked. On the 8th July, the whole project will culminate in a Mela (an Indian word for festival). There will be a host of sporting stations that children from our school, our clusters schools and the community can come and have a go out. Stickers and medals will be handed out for trying new sports. The dances will also be performed on an outdoor stage and there will be a live link to Delhi. Chef will ensure there are some taster stations to try Indian snacks.
