



School Attendance – a very important message for all parents/carers September 2022

Dear Parent/Carer,

This is an important update about school attendance for the 2022/23 academic year.

Hillstone Primary School is working in partnership with parents and the Local Authority to improve school attendance.

A big thank you to the majority of parents who make sure their children attend school regularly!

Your efforts, working in partnership with the school, will ensure that your child will have the best chance to achieve their academic potential and have real opportunity in further education and the world of work. It will also enable your child to:

- access the lessons needed to achieve their expected grades
- maintain friendships and develop new ones
- have access to social and sporting events offered by the school
- explore potential careers
- develop work habits such as good punctuality which are essential to thrive in the world of employment

How does your child compare?

Attendance during one school year	equals this number of days absent	which is approximately this many weeks absent	which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons

If you are worried about your child/children's attendance the first port of call is to discuss your concerns with the school directly. The school has specialist staff who may be able to help, and all schools work closely with health and council teams who





may also be able to help if needed. If you have concerns about mental health; domestic abuse; parenting; bereavement; finance; problems with drugs and alcohol; you can find help and support from the 'From Birmingham with Love' webpage:

Family holidays in term time are not allowed in law and are unlikely to be authorised. Family emergencies also need careful consideration. It is not always appropriate or in the best interests of the child to miss school for emergencies which are being dealt with by adult family members. Notifying the school of leave due to a family emergency does not mean it will be authorised.

Please note that where parents fail to ensure their child attends school regularly, legal action, including penalty notices, may be considered.

Attendance Matters

What you can do:

- Always remember that your child should only be absent from school for serious reasons
- 2. If your child is absent, please contact the office from 8am onwards
- 3. Make every effort to book medical appointments outside of school hours, where this is not possible, evidence will be needed to support the absence
- 4. Holidays are not authorised during term time.
- 5. Ensure that your child arrives before 8.45am we now open our doors at 8.40am
- 6. Use breakfast club this is open from 8.00am. There is a small charge of 40p per day, please use Scopay to book your child's place.

What Hillstone will do:

- 1. We will make contact with you on the first day of absence, if we do not hear from you first
- 2. If your child's attendance falls below 90% we will write to you
- 3. If there is no improvement we will invite you to meet with Mrs Gibbon and the attendance social worker to discuss issues that may be affecting your child's attendance
- 4. Hillstone rewards high attendance through certificates and rewards.

We are here to support you. Attendance is the key to success.
