Why is Samuel Pepys' diary an important historical source?

What happened after the fire?

We are learning this because this is an important historical event in British history. We will be looking at London 400 years ago.

We will understand why the fire burned for so long and why that kind of fire wouldn't happen today.

We will also recognise some of the key names in the Great Fire of London events and understand the role that they played.

We will also use a timeline to record the events in order.

Key people



Thomas Farriner

Thomas Farriner is the owner of the bakery on Pudding Lane where the fire started.



Samuel Pepys

Samuel Pepys lived in London during the Great Fire of London and wrote about it in his diary.



King Charles II

Charles II was the King of England in 1666. After the fire, he made a rule that houses must be built further apart and built from stone not wood.
