

Year 2 Travel and Transport

Key facts

We use lots of different forms of transport depending on where we are going and what we are carrying.

From the earliest times, people have used horses and carts to travel and to transport goods from one place to another. The Vikings are well known for using longboats to move from one country to another — including Britain.

In 1829, George Stephenson built the steam train called, 'Stephenson's Rocket.' The steam train changed the way people moved goods and travelled. Many city people, even the poorer workers, were able to travel to the seaside for the first time.

The first petrol engine car was invented in 1885 by Karl Benz, from Germany.

1903 saw the first successful plane flight. The Wright brothers were the first people to successfully fly in a plane.
