
Year 2 Let's Go On A Journey Geography

We will be learning the names of the continents and oceans of the world and learning about world climate



<u>Prior learning</u> In Year 1 the children studied Shard End in Birmingham.

The children also studied their country, England, as part of the UK.

In Year 2, the children take a look at the wider world, naming the continents and oceans and the world climate zones.

## Key Facts...

The world is split into **7 continents**.

The continents are :- North America, South America, Africa, Europe, Asia, Antarctica and Australia/Oceania. There are <u>5 oceans</u>. These are:- The Atlantic, The Pacific, The Southern Ocean, The Indian Ocean and The Arctic Ocean.

The Equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the earth. The North and South Poles are at the northernmost and southernmost points of the earth. The world's climate alters depending on where in the world you are in relation to the poles and the Equator.
