During this project, we will be piecing together a timeline of British history from the Stone Age through to Roman Britain.

Key Questions

- Where and when were the most important changes in Britain's ancient history?
- What are the key features of life in the Stone Age, Bronze Age, Iron Age, Romans, Anglo-Saxons Vikings and Normans?
- How did the ancient civilizations live, feed themselves, and govern themselves?
- There so few artefacts from those times so how do we know about the past?
- Why did people from other places come to Britain to live?
- Why did each early civilization end?

Prior Learning

So far, whilst you have been historians at Hillstone, you have:

- Explored the effect of historical events on modern day life, including the change in materials used for the making of everyday objects.
- Discovered the differences in life between the rich and poor.
- Gained an awareness of the past and history beyond living memory when learning about the Great Fire of London.
- Gained an understanding of the role of a hierarchy on society.


