# Nursery How Many Colours in the Rainbow?



#### Overview:

Children will be the drivers in their exploration of colour throughout this project. They will mix, compare, sort and create colour using a variety of media. Each week, children will focus on a new colour to learn about it's tones, also exploring how to use colour to communicate thoughts and feelings.

## Key Questions

- What are the primary colours?
- How can we change colours?
- What needs to happen to create a darker tone?
- What needs to happen to create a lighter tone?
- How can we sort the items by colour?
- How do the colours make you feel?
- Can we link a colour to a specific feeling or action?

## Primary colour

Three commonly used colours; red, blue and yellow and when combined in different ways, they create other colours and tones.

Combining two colours together

Vocabulary

Mix

The lightness or darkness of a colour.

Predict

Tone

To say what you think will happen.
